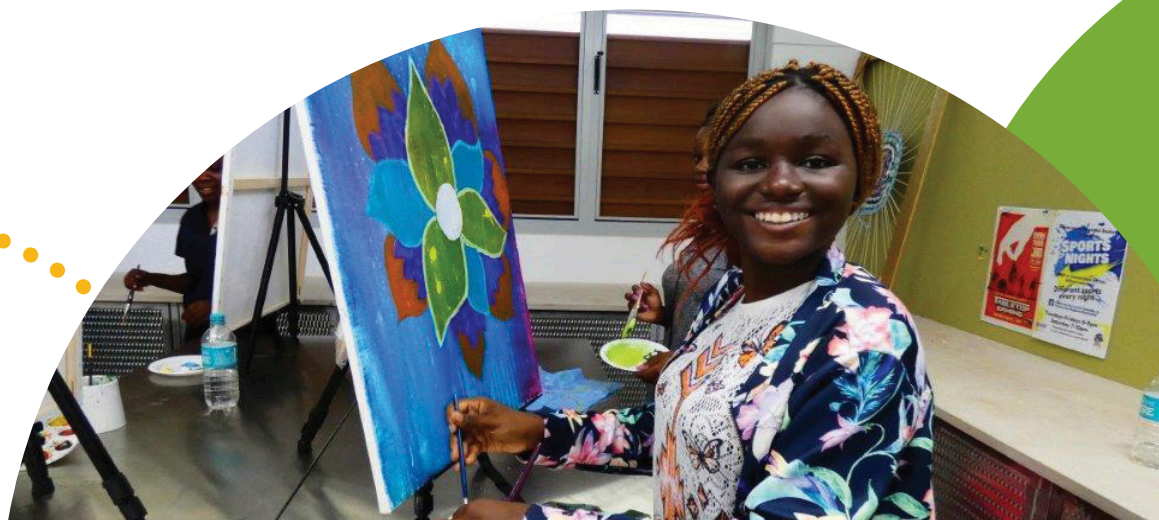


# Our resume of selected key achievements since 2000

1999 – 2000	Conducted the <i>Sticks and Stones</i> community development program
2001 – 2003	Developed and implemented the <i>Strong People Strong Stories</i> community arts project
<b>2002</b>	<b>Became the central settlement service provider for newly arrived refugees in the Northern Territory</b>
2003	Awarded the <i>National Bank Volunteer Award</i>
2003 – 2005	Secured funding from DFaHCSIA to implement the <i>Families in Cultural Transition (FICT)</i> program
2004	Melaleuca formalised World Refugee Day Celebrations as an annual Flagstaff Celebration with communities in the NT
2005	Established a Refugee Support Network to ensure seamless support to clients at an interagency level
2007 – 2008	Introduced the NAYSS program to Melaleuca's young clients
2008 – 2009	Secured NT Government funding for the Families in Cultural Transition (FICT) program for three years and introduced a new module to the program, <i>Welcome to Country</i> , an initiative for families of refugee background to get to know and experience Indigenous culture
2009 – 2010	Introduced a family program and Tips and Ideas for Parenting Skills
2010	Partnered with Nightcliff Primary and won a National Australia Bank School First grant to support refugee students at the school
2012	Implemented an Alternatives to Violence program
2012 – 2013	Produced the booklet <i>Healthy Living for New Arrivals: Volunteer Guide</i> together with City of Darwin and Red Cross.
